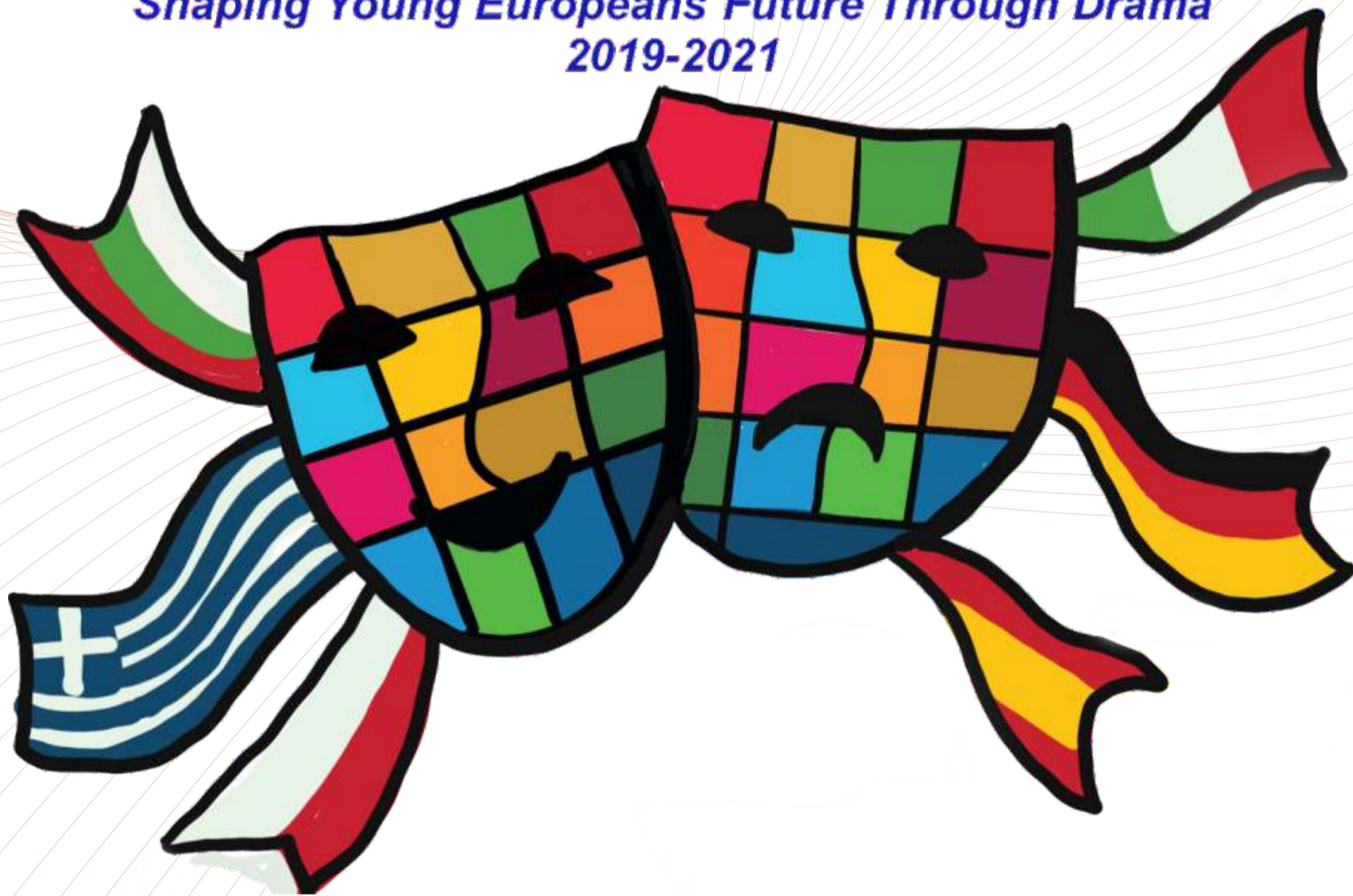

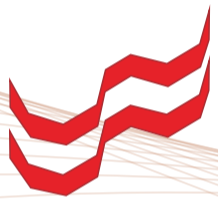

Even more – one in three – suffer from some form of malnutrition. The SDGs aim to end all forms of hunger and malnutrition by 2030, making sure all people – especially children and the more vulnerable – have access to sufficient and nutritious food all year round.

Artist: „The young teacher“ – Timoleon Marie Lobrichon
Timoleon Marie Lobrichon was a French painter of genre scenes and portraits. He was born in Cornod (Jura) on April 26th, 1831. Lobrichon was skillful in his rendering of children at their pastimes and revealed not only their images but their characters in a very real way. He developed the genre to a high degree of detail and finish, leaving the viewer to marvel at his interpretation. He was winning medals in 1868 & 1882 and was awarded the Legion of Honour in 1883. He died on December 9th, 1914 in Paris.

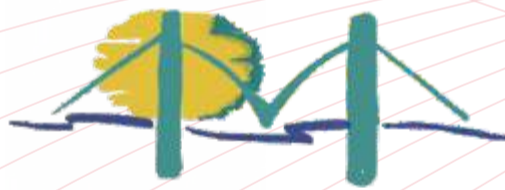

Artist:
The work of art chosen to represent this goal is the painting "Selfportrait in the border among the Love Embrace of the Universe, the Earth (Mexico), Myself, Diego and Señor Xólotl", created by Frida Kahlo in 1949. It is full of elements from ancient Mexican mythology that stand for different dichotomies, among them men and women. She tries to represent the world as a continuous opposition of elements which need each other and are linked through two female deities: Mother Earth and the Universal Mother.

SDG6 – Clean water and sanitation



"Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all."

Water and sanitation are at the very core of sustainable development, critical to the survival of people and the planet. Goal 6 not only addresses the issues relating to drinking water, sanitation and hygiene, but also the quality and sustainability of water resources worldwide.

Despite progress is being made, millions of people still lack water and sanitation services.

1 in 3 people globally do not have access to safe drinking water. 2.2 billion people around the world do not have safely managed drinking water services, 4.2 billion people do not have safely managed sanitation services, and 3 billion lack basic handwashing facilities.



Artist:

Édouard Manet (1832-1883) was a French painter. One of the first nineteenth century artists to approach modern-life subjects, he was a pivotal figure in the transition from Realism to Impressionism. Manet, like many other artists, opposes academic drawing and goes out to talk in free streets and cafes seeking beauty in small human relationships without creating a color difference between the castes.

SDG 10

Reduce inequality within and among countries



Inequality exists in various forms, such as economic, sex, disability, race, social inequality, as well as in different forms of discrimination. It harms poverty reduction and destroys people's sense of fulfilment and self-worth. Almost 2 in 10 people reported having personally experienced discrimination on at least one of the grounds established by international human rights law.

Artist:

René Magritte /November 21, 1898 - August 15, 1967/

This is one of the most famous masterpieces of renowned painter, René Magritte. Created in 1955 in Brussels, Belgium, the surreal painting displays realistic figures in a surreal light. Known as a contemporary art genius, this art piece is still talked about today.

Artist

The artist is Caravaggio, who was born in 1571 in Italy. The painting represents Bacchus with red and plump cheeks who looks relaxed and self-contained. All the energy of this painting is concentrated in the glass of wine, that is why we have wanted to replace it by a wind mill, to put emphasis on sustainability. There is also a sense of decadence represented by fruit which is beginning to rot as well as the leaves on the god's head which are turning brown.

Artist

The painter Edvard Munch was a Norwegian painter, belonging to the fore-runners of expressionism. He was born on December 12, 1863, in the village of Andalsbrück in Norway and grew up in Oslo. Munch is symbolic in content, depicting a state of mind rather than an external reality. He was not intended to depict a random moment of reality, but in situations where there are intense

emotional content and expressive energy. He calculated his compositions to create a restless, tense atmosphere. In 1893 he created "The Scream", his most famous work.

SDG 14 – Life Below Water



The world's oceans – their temperature, chemistry, currents, and life – drive global systems that make the Earth habitable for humankind. How we manage this vital resource is essential for humanity. Over three billion people depend on marine and coastal biodiversity. However, today 30 percent of the world's fish stocks has been overexploited. Oceans also absorb about 30 percent of the carbon dioxide produced by humans. Marine pollution is reaching alarming levels, with an average of 13,000 pieces of plastic litter on every square kilometre of the ocean. The message of the selected painting is to draw our attention to the great importance and richness of the underwater life which must be protected.



Message:

„Save and protect marine and coastal ecosystems as essential for the survival of humanity!“

Artist:

Giuseppe Arcimboldo was an Italian artist whose paintings, created in the XVI century, during the Renaissance, depicted human faces made up of different animals or objects. Water is represented by marine creatures. It belongs to the series "The Four elements" painted in 1566 for Maximilian II, Holy Roman Emperor. The series attempts to express the creation of harmony from chaos.

Goal 15 – Life on Earth



Human life depends on the earth as much as the ocean for our sustenance and livelihoods. Every year, 13 million hectares of forests are lost, while the persistent degradation of drylands has led to the desertification of 3.6 billion hectares, disproportionately affecting poor communities. While 15 percent of land is protected, biodiversity is still at risk. Nearly 7,000 species of animals and plants have been illegally traded. Wildlife trafficking not only erodes biodiversity, but creates insecurity, fuels conflict, and feeds corruption.



Message:

„Urgent action must be taken to reduce the loss of natural habitats and biodiversity which are part of our common heritage and support global food and water security, climate change mitigation and adaptation, and peace and security!“

Artist:

Wendy Andrew is an English artist famous for her paintings based on nature, mythology.

Wendy's paintings can be seen reproduced as prints and cards as well as in various publications. Wendy hopes that the images she creates will bring a feeling of oneness, love and care.

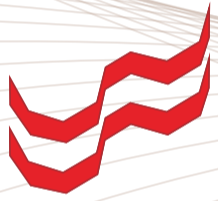

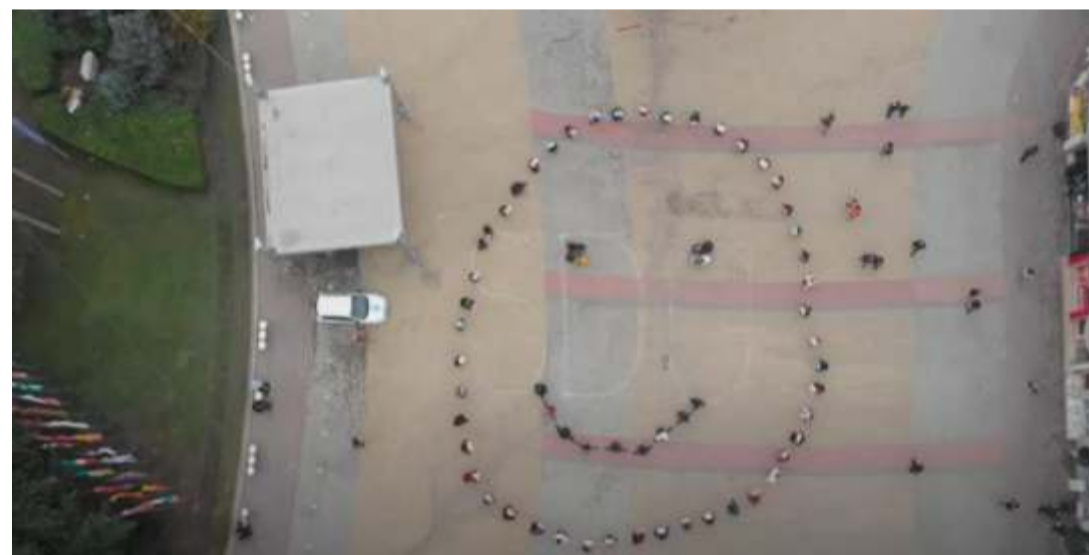
